Annexure – II

(i) Transparancy of the Evaluation System

Goal

The Context

There is scope of improvement only when one is made aware of the areas where they lack understanding. Keeping this fact in mind we try to bring improvement in the student's performance by making them aware of their mistakes. It is also imperative that the results are declared in the presence of the parents only. This practice avoids any kind of problems or misreporting on the part of the students which may happen if the parents are not informed about the date and time of result declaration.

Problems
Encountered and
Resources required

There are not many problems encountered with this practice. The only problem that is faced is that sometimes the parents are not able to come on the given date and time due to which we are unable to handover the results to the concerned student.

The Practice

The checked answer scripts are shown to the students to make them understand their strengths and weaknesses and also to guide them for further improvement. The answer scripts are shown in the presence of their mentors so that the students can clarify their doubts and take guidance to approach a particular question in the correct way.

The teacher in-charge hand over the mark sheet to the parents and takes their counter sign. This system also makes the parents aware about the progress of their daughter and allows them to take guidance of the respective teacher for improvement.
