#### Annexure – 5 (Criterion – VII (7.3)

#### (i) Peer Group Teaching

Goal

The goal of the peer group teaching is the following:

- To promote leadership and skill development in students
- To foster better communication among the students
- To enable them to learn from each other's first hand experiences
- To create awareness about the crucial issues in the society

The Context

Students learn maximum from the experiences of their friends/classmates/peers, and therefore every year Peer Group Teaching is conducted by all the departments. This program is an opportunity whereby the students get firsthand information and training from their fellow mates and thus the learning is to the maximum. Students are more comfortable in asking questions and clearing their doubts from peers who are almost of the same age.

**Problems Encounter** 

No major problems are faced in organizing the training sessions. The students need to be to be motivated to attend the sessions as they sometimes feel that learning from their fellow mates will not be of much use.

Resources required

The resource required is the availability of both the groups – the trainers and the learners. Usually the training is conducted in the respective classrooms and laboratories where the training equipment and environment is readily available. Sometimes the training is conducted in the premises of another schools and colleges.

The Practice

Every year the third year students gain a lot of knowledge and skills in their respective fields during internship and various field training. This opportunity is tapped in by organizing sessions in which they train the second year students as well as their fellow classmates in areas that they have garnered exposure into.

Every year National Breast Feeding Week and National Nutrition Week is celebrated by the college in which the students under the guidance of the faculty train fellow students and make them aware of the importance of breast feeding and health in general.

Evidence of Success

It has been observed that the students understand the subject better if trained by the students.

Programs related to breast feeding and nutrition have been accepted well by other schools and colleges.

# (ii) Adopting teaching learning processes such as e-group and phone groups for assignment and projects.

Goal

- To make the faculty as well as the students more reachable to each other
- To increase the communication between the students and teachers
- To aid continuation of teaching learning process even outside the four walls of the classroom

The Context

The semester pattern of teaching makes everything very hurried, and therefore the availability of the teachers to the students and the students to the teachers is very limited. This limitation needs to be overcome, and staying connected to for continuous communication is the need of the hour.

Problems
Encountered and
Resources required

Not all students have access to internet and smart phones are not available at everybody's disposal. Another problem faced is the reluctance of the students to participate in the group.

The main resource required is internet access, availability of smart phones and computers. It is also important that the students as well as the teachers take initiative and form e-groups as well as register themselves on the websites used for the purpose.

The Practice

Mentors have formed Whatsapp groups with their respective batches. Some of the faculty have also registered themselves on websites like Edmodo in which the faculty can send assignments, quizs etc to the students who in turn can submit online assignments and can also solve quiz. Any kind of information can be easily given to the students at any hour.

**Evidence of Success** 

Registering in e-groups is optional and thus large number of students participating in online groups is a proof that they feel and want to stay connected so that no information is missed out and queries can be solved immediately.
